Ms. Nesbitt:

On May 7, 2026, a hearing was held, during which you pled guilty to the charges of professional misconduct. The charges stem from multiple breaches of patient privacy and confidentiality while you were practicing as a Registered Nurse at the ██████████ in ██████████, Saskatchewan.

The Discipline Committee considered the factors of your misconduct. All Registered Nurses who provide care in Saskatchewan are bound to maintain a high level of professionalism and ethical practice. Registered Nurses must practice in accordance with provisions of legislation, Bylaws, Code of Ethics, Practice Standards and Competencies.

You were found to have contravened the following:

- a) Section 26(1) & (2) of *The Registered Nurses Act*, 1988: Professional misconduct
- b) Section 2, Bylaw IV of *The CRNS Bylaws, 2023*: Obligations to adhere to the CNA Code of Ethics, and nursing practice standards and entry-level competencies.
- c) Section D of the *Code of Ethics of Registered Nurses (2017)*: Honouring Dignity
- d) Section E of the *Code of Ethics of Registered Nurses (2017)*: Maintaining Privacy and Confidentiality
- e) Section G of the *Code of Ethics for Registered Nurses, 2017*: Being Accountable
- f) *SRNA Registered Nurse Practice Standards, 2019*:
 - i. Standard 1: Professional Responsibility and Accountability
 - ii. Standard 3: Ethical Practice
 - iii. Standard 5: Self-Regulation
- g) *SRNA Registered Nurse Entry-Level Competencies, 2019*:
 - 2. Being a professional nurse

During deliberations, the Discipline Committee noted you were remorseful and have undertaken further reflection and education to improve your practice. However, your conduct fell well below the ethical standards of a prudent and professional Registered Nurse and had wide reaching implications for many Saskatchewan residents who rely on us. Your actions were contrary to the core values of our highly esteemed and honourable profession. You have brought disrepute on yourself and on the profession of Registered Nursing. The Discipline Committee can not condone this behaviour and you are hereby reprimanded.

It is the Discipline Committee's expectation that you will continue to reflect on the impact your misconduct had on the public and going forward, commit to fulfilling your duties in a professional and ethical manner. This College of Registered Nurses of Saskatchewan reprimand shall also serve to caution you that any reoccurrence of professional misconduct on your part may be considered just cause for more severe disciplinary action.
